Los Angeles, CA, October 1, 2025 – In recognition of October's National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM), Goodwill Southern California (GSC) will hold two Disability Resource & Career Fairs – one on October 7th in Los Angeles and the second on October 9th in San Bernardino.

National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM) is an annual recognition of the positive impact of people with disabilities in the American workforce. It was originally set as a weeklong event in October in 1945. Congress declared it as a month-long event in 1988. The 2025 theme is "Celebrating Value and Talent".
